
Construction of a game:









A MAN OF LETTERS OR A THINKER

AND HTS HEAD




































2. ARTISTS AT WORK












These students are engaged in the creation of "a piece of art", a vase to fill with sweets and small chocolates that will be "the treasure hunt prize".

It is very huge and wears a long red tunic. What you can see is just the head, the feet and a hand.















It seems just a foot with a sandal that is part of a large statue. Instead it was used to bury a child.








He could be a man of letters or a thinker and his head, with a very long curly beard and wavy hair, was found in the strait of Messina.












It is a beautiful statue of a standing nude young man that represents the idea of youth. Originally, he stood with his left foot forward and his arms at his sides, looking straight ahead.










They were used to transport liquids or food in the transport boats.
